PAST EVENTS (JANUARY 2019 - MAY 2019)

OVERVIEW

Ghana is the first African Country to organize a concerted effort to commemorate the 400 year anniversary of the arrival of the first enslaved African in the United States in 1619. The "Year of Return, Ghana 2019" is a yearlong commemoration and celebration of the global African resilience. In September 2018, the President of the Republic, Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, launched this initiative in Washington following a successful local launch at the National Theatre in Accra, Ghana in August 2018.

Since January 2019, several events & activities including investment meetings, Spiritual Pilgrimage, Gospel Shows, Cultural & wellness program have been held.
